As a Police Officer with the University of Houston, you will be a member of an accredited, professional police department with the responsibility of overseeing the safety and security of a community of over 60,000 people, including over 8,000 on-campus residents. University of Houston Police Officers have the responsibility of patrolling over 660 acres, enforcing criminal and traffic laws, and responding to the same types of calls for assistance, service and hazardous situations that are found in similarly situated municipal settings. The University of Houston Police Department offers training opportunities for all officers, and opportunities for specialization and rapid advancement for officers willing to apply themselves. UHPD's position within a major university also presents substantial opportunities for special event overtime, unrivaled by other area departments.

Starting pay rate: \$42,000 for applicants with 0-3 years of police experience
\$44,000 for applicants with 4-7 years of police experience
\$46,000 for applicants with 8+ years of police experience

Monthly Step Plan Intervals (based on UHPD service only)

2 to 4 years - \$100, 5 to 9 years - \$200, 10 to 14 years - \$300, 15 to 19 years - \$400, 20+ - \$500

Hazardous Duty (based on state commissioned service)

Receive \$10/month times years of service (ie. 2 years of service = \$20/month)

Education Pay Stipend following probationary period:

60 hrs college or Intermediate PO certification - \$100/month

Bachelors degree or Advanced PO certification - \$200/month

Masters degree or Master PO certification - \$300/month

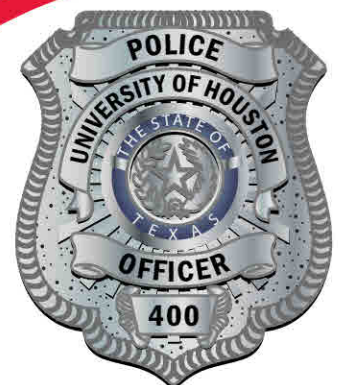

- Responds to all calls for assistance, service, and hazardous situations.
- Conducts preliminary investigations of reported incidents, completes required reports.
- Conducts crime prevention program presentations.
- Attends required annual training seminars.
- Utilizes police equipment such as firearm, baton, handcuffs, mobile and handheld radios, camera and other equipment.
- Performs other job-related duties are assigned.

Qualifications

- High school and No experience.
