# **ANNUAL REPORTING**

## **ANNUAL RACIAL PROFILING REPORT**

Each year from January 1 – March 1, all law enforcement agencies are required to submit their Annual Racial Profiling Report. **Agencies will be asked a few extra questions this upcoming reporting period, beginning January 2025.** 

Before you start your annual report, your agency will be asked the follow simple questions:

- Verify your Chief Administrator's name
- Select the implementation status that best describes your agency's compliance with the approaching changes to TCOLE Rule 211.16, law enforcement agency standards.
- Complete the attestation with your name and date. (see below)

### What is the purpose of these questions?

The addition of these new questions serves two purposes:

- Educate law enforcement agencies of their new requirements. While most LEAs are aware of the new requirements at this point, we still encounter agencies out there that are not aware of the rule change. The annual report provides information about the rule, summaries the requirements, and references the rule language.
- Gauge where TCOLE should focus resources. The annual report serves as a survey to gauge how many agencies are already compliant, and how many are still working on meeting the requirements. Reporting compliance status as "Additional support needed" will prompt support from a TCOLE field service agent. The rule does not go into effect until September 1, 2025.

# LICENSEE SERVICE REPORT LOOKUP

### COMING SOON: PUBLIC LICENSE LOOKUP

Licensee service reports include training records, training compliance status, and license issuance date. Importantly, much like the personal status report that has long been a commonly requested document, absolutely no private or personal identifying information is included.

This new service is set to launch on September 1, 2024. The application will include the service reports for all Texas peace officers, jailers, and telecommunicators who hold or have held a TCOLE license.

An account is required to begin a search. [Below] is an early prototype of the login screen where you can create an account, or login. You will be able to search by licensee name department, license type, and/or service dates.



As an additional layer of security, the statute creating this feature included a process for excluding peace officers involved in undercover operations or other active sensitive operations from the public-facing search. At the time of this article, TCOLE staff is in the process of finalizing the process to request the exclusion of such officers from the Public License Lookup application. A technical assistance bulletin will be forthcoming with further information. Please monitor your email and the TCOLE website for updates.

# **EDUCATION SERVICES**



#### **ELEMENTARY EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH**

Education Services has created an Elementary Educational Outreach training to advance best practices of engagement of youth involving peace officers. This course is a 1-hour training and will be open for public comment in the coming days.



#### **BASIC MISSING AND EXPLOITED PERSONS**

The new Basic Missing and Exploited Persons IRG (course #3275) was published to the TCOLE website May 2024. Please note it is now an 8-hour course and the hours have been updated in TCLEDDS. The previous 4-hour curriculum has been retired. All trainings must be the new, updated curriculum. The content will be incorporated into the BPOC next year.



#### **TRAUMA-INFORMED APPROACH TO SEXUAL ASSAULT INVESTIGATIONS**

Education Services is updating the online version of Trauma-Informed Approach to Sexual Assault Investigations (course #470). The updated course will be live on MyTCOLE 3.0 later this summer. Once the course has been updated, TCOLE will archive the existing online course number (470). Both trainings (online and inperson) are 16 hours of training and will be reported as course #4070.



#### **NEW ON MYTCOLE 3.0**

The Texas Department of Public Safety Training and Operations Division online version of CITP is now available on MyTCOLE 3.0.

TCOLE is hosting an online training provided by the AHA Foundation on Female Genital Mutilation. The course is currently available on MyTCOLE 3.0.

# **ALERRT TRAINING**

The passage of Senate Bill 1852 requires **all peace officers to attend ALERRT Level 1 training at least once prior to 8/31/2027**. Courses which will satisfy this requirement include #3311, #3313, and train-the-trainer #3315. This new law also requires that every peace officer attain 16 hours of ALERRT training every two years going forward.

Peace officers who have previously completed course #3311, #3313, or #3315 and have at least one of these courses documented one their TCOLE training record do not need to repeat ALERRT Level 1 training; however, they must take at least 16 hours of ALERRT training during this 2-year training unit before 8/31/2025. Courses which will satisfy the 16-hour requirement are included in the approved list below.

Peace officers who do NOT have course #3311, #3313, or #3315 documented on their TCOLE training record are encouraged to complete course #3311 during this current training unit prior to 8/31/2025 as their 16-hour continuing education requirement if at all possible. If not completed during this training unit, they MUST have completed #3311 prior to 8/31/2027 in accordance with Senate Bill 1852.




