Initiates arrests, when appropriate, in response to Federal, State, and local laws and city ordinances.

Responds to all emergency situations.

Investigates traffic accidents, fire, burglary, robbery alarms, and security door alarms.

Prepares and submits required reports on incidents, accidents, and offenses.

Patrolling the area and monitoring activities at the airport and its terminals may require standing, walking, twisting, kneeling, and may require running, handling a firearm and modern police equipment in response to emergencies.

High school diploma or GED equivalent (recognized by the Texas Education Agency or a regional accrediting agency. Valid Class 'C' Texas Driver's License.

Must be able to successfully pass a psychological evaluation administered by a Psychologist/Psychiatrist employed by the City of San Antonio to determine the Applicant's mental clarity and stability with respect to the high stresses associated with law enforcement activities.

Must be able to successfully pass a screening for illicit drug use and a polygraph examination administered by a licensed polygraph examiner hired by the City of San Antonio.

Traffic citations for four (4) or more hazardous moving traffic offenses with any disposition other than "not guilty" within the twelve (12) months preceding the date of application is a disqualifying item.

Involvement as a driver in two (2) or more motor vehicle accidents within the preceding twenty-four (24) months where the applicant's actions contributed to the accident in any way.
