


Log into IAM

ANNOUNCEMENTS

- On March 1, 2023 TCOLE began only accepting electronic submissions of the Appointment of a License (L1), Telecommunicator Appointment (L1-T), and Seperation of a License (F5) through TCLEDDS.
- July 2022 TCOLE purchased TCLEDDS. Please contact TCOLE Online Support for questions and issues. PCI is no longer assisting with account support.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- 🏂 All TCLEDDS users must have a PID. Prior to requesting a new account for a civilian, submit a C1 for them to obtain a PID.
- 🤻 All TCLEDDS account change requests must be sent via email by either the agency's chief administrator or their designee.



Annual Reporting

On the left-hand side, you will see a menu. Under 'Annual Reporting', there is an option to submit your racial profiling report.

Required Annual Reporting

- Annual reporting consists of two parts, that are required for <u>all</u> agencies.
- Part 1: LEA minimum standards must be completed prior to completing Part 2: Racial Profiling Report.

ANNUAL REPORTING

Each law enforcement agency must complete an online report annually and provide evidence that they meet the requirements outlined infrom January 1 to March 1, each year. Each agency must complete

Part 1 then Part 2.

PART 1: LEA MINIMUM STANDARDS

REQUIRED Each Law Enforcement Agency must complete an online report annually. This year's report requires that you review TAC §211.16 and acknowledge the agency standards that will take effect September 1, 2025.

PART 2: RACIAL PROFILING REPORTING

REQUIRED Each law enforcement agency must file a full report or exemption online annually.

Texas Occupations Code §1701.164 specifies that TCOLE collect incident-based data in accordance with the Code of Criminal Procedure Articles §2.131 – §2.138. Chief administrators of law enforcement agencies that meet the criteria must submit racial profiling reports to *their governing body*, as well as TCOLE.

BODY WORN CAMERA

Reporting required under §1701.653, only for law enforcement agencies receiving grant funds from the Office of the Governor for body worn cameras or body worn camera storage.

LEA Minimum Standards

- If your agency hasn't completed the LEA minimum standards, they will need to click Part 1: LEA Minimum Standards, which will direct the web user to the next page. If the web user clicks Racial Profiling Reporting first, they may see the Review & Acknowledge Standards ' button, which will direct them to the self-assessment, as well.
- Click the 'Review & Acknowledge Standards' button.

ANNUAL – LEA MINIMUM STANDARDS
